My First Quilt

When I was born, my grandmother gave me a beautiful handmade quilt as a present. I used to be wrapped in it when I was a baby. It is made of small pieces of cloth that were sewn together. My grandmother made it herself, so it is even more valuable. I still have it. I do not really use it that much now. It just collects dust somewhere most of the time, but I believe I should take better care of it. Although it is thin, it actually keeps you pretty warm. I would like to pass it on to my kids, because it is really awesome and you will not see so many handmade objects these days.

#### My Personal Heritage

In my case, it is a 50-litas note. It used to be former Lithuanian currency before the adoption of the euro in 2015. I highly appreciate it because it means a lot to me. Actually, although it is just a banknote, it is extremely valuable for me because I got it from my grandmother as a birthday present. It happened in 2009. I was 9 years old. Sadly, but it was the last birthday that I celebrated with my grandmother. After a few days she passed away. It was the last thing I got from her, that is why it is so important to me. I did not spend it, even though it looked like a big amount of money at that time. I decided to save the money and now I always keep this banknote in my wallet. Five years later, Lithuania changed its currency and we have euros now. 50 litas is only 15 euros. That is not much. It might be of higher value in the future but I have decided to pass it on to my future children and save the last memory of my grandma.



## My Grandmother's Spinning Wheel

My grandmother has a very old Lithuanian spinning wheel. The spinning wheel was used for yarn spinning. My grandmother used to raise sheep for wool. She fed them and, in general, took good care of them. Sheep wool was sheared every spring and autumn. When the wool was cut, my grandmother prepared it for spinning. It was laborious and time-consuming work to turn wool into yarn. When the yarn was made, my grandmother would make socks and sweaters for her children and husband. Yarn can be made from linen, but my grandmother did not grow linen, because it was even harder and longer work than raising sheep and shearing them.

This spinning wheel is about 100 years old now. My grandmother got it from her mother. It is the oldest object we have kept. It is still working, so my grandmother is still using it. When the time comes, my grandmother will give it to her daughter, i.e. my mom. I want it to be passed on, because it is not only our family asset, but it is also an old Lithuanian object that very few families possess today.

This instrument is a type of drum originally from Guinea in West Africa, is very old and is still important in African cultures, especially in the Mandingue region (which includes Mali, Guinea, Burkina Faso, Senegal and Cote D'Ivore).

When my grandfather died, about 13 years ago, we discovered a Djembe among his things, among many other he brought on trips he made when he was young.

My grandfather bought this djembe on one of this trips and he gave this instrument to my father when he was little, and years later, my father gave me this djembe and he gave me this instrument, not only to be an inheritance, but because he knows how much I love music.

For me, music is very important because I think it brings a balance to our life. We all have our good and bad days. When I'm having a bad day, I lie down on the couch, put on the headphones and choose a song... I attend a music school near my house and I've been playing guitar for 3 years. We have already done many presentations for families and friends. But at the beginnings of last month we gave a presentation at a festival in the area. There were lot of people there to watch and everyone felt a little nervous, but when it came to my turn, and the drumming set the tone, the nerves I had disappeared...

And of course, when I have children, I will transmit these values.




#### The spoon

#### Description of the object:

My subject is the 'Geleitslöffel' from Seligenstadt. This is a big spoon and an important subject of the history of my hometown Seligenstadt.

#### What is/was it used for?

In the past merchants travelled in a convoy to the fair of Frankfurt - an important trading town close to Seligenstadt. My hometown used to be the last stop before the final destination being just one day ride away.





#### What is it made of?

It is brown and from walnut-tree wood. His masses are 77 centimeters amount to them chains in the spoon hangs amounts to proud 110 centimeters. It consists of a piece of wood.

#### Why is it relavant to me?

It is relevant to me because it belongs to my family since 1861, besides, it is a subject very importantly for the history (story) of my homeland city Seligenstadt.

#### Why do I want it to be passed over?

I want it to be handed over because it is already very old and I want it to be many years older

Who would i pass it on to?

I would like to hand it to my children or grandchildren.

What can you do to preserve the object you have chosen?

#### The plushy

My most important personal heritage is a plushy, that looks like an angel with light pink dress and yellowish fuzzy hair. On the end of the arms from that dress and on the end of the dress is a fluffy white material and on the dress is a golden moon and star attached. Under the dress the Engel is wearing a light pink leotard and light pink white striped socks. Besides that she is wearing a headband with the same moon and star attached. I know that that may sound a little cheesy, but it has a good reason that I chose this angel for my personal heritage. That normal Plushy is the one I had with me in a traumatizing accident. Back then I was still a lonely child and was allowed to sit in the front "so that my Angel can see better", that later actually saved my live because I wasn't in the back seat. We, my mom and I were driving full speed



in Aschaffenburg a city nearby we wanted to go visit my Grandma. On an intersection a car cut our way and hit us in the back. The next thing I remember is a stranger trying to calm me, but I was just screaming. We than got flown by an emergency helicopter to the next hospital. My daddy was called and was already waiting at the hospital. The doctors told us that my mom had a broken pelvis and I had a blue eye, I was so lucky I didn't sat in the back seat otherwise I had got smashed, the angel saved my life.I want to pass on that angel to future generations not so much because of the plushy itself more because of the story behind it.

#### The lizard fossil

The object I chose is an imprint of a lizard fossil. It's made of a kind of plastic like material and about 10 cm wide and high. You can use it as decor but I personal just had it in a drawer. It's an imprint of a fossil from a German Museum named Senckenbergmuseum that's located in Frankfurt. Sadly I can't find any further information about the original fossil. The story behind this object is a little bit complicated. My grandfather used to work at this museum as a tour



guide and was the director on of the research ships nearby. So me and my sister often spent time at this museum and went there multiple times every month. The museum was kind of home already. We knew the people who worked there and they knew us. We as well got to go behind the scenes and get a good look there. We got to conserve a heart of an animal and made an imprint of a fossil. The fossil I chose as my object isn't the one I made, mine broke a few years ago and my grandfather gave me the imprint he did that day. This imprint symbolizes my good connection to my grandparents and reminds me of the many days we spent together. It reminds me of my childhood and the many adventures we had at the museum Senckenbergmuseum. I would like to pass it on to my children's if I'm going to have some, to keep the memory of my grandfather alive and share something about my childhood. I can preserve it while I tell my children about that object and visit the museum so they can have a connection to it, so it's not just a random object.
